Retirement of The Rector, Standon

With John and Basma leaving us following John's retirement at the beginning of October, the obvious question on everyone's lips is "When are we going to get a new vicar?" This being the Church of England, frustratingly, the answer is 'Not any time soon.

There is a set of protocols each benefice has to undergo when a post becomes vacant, all set out by the church 'powers that be'. The first hurdle is that nothing could begin until the current incumbent, John, had actually left.

The benefice has three patrons who are almost like non-executive directors. These are Ralph Abel Smith, the Church Pastoral Aid Society and King's College Cambridge. They particularly take an interest when a living goes into vacancy.

Our PCCs from the three churches met with the patrons and the Archdeacon in mid-October to start the process. We have prepared a Benefice Profile which effectively is a brochure of what the three churches can offer a new Rector, and what in


turn we expect from any candidate. Now that is agreed, we can look to advertise. Given the proximity to Christmas when clergy are preoccupied with the busiest time of their year, there will be no point in advertising until January 2026.

The process then depends on how appealing our benefice is to potential applicants, and how quickly we can arrange interviews and appoint. If I tell you that the Bishop of Hertford has already agreed to

take important services during Easter next year, if needed, you can judge for yourself how soon we might expect the post to be filled. It could be a year, or longer, that we have to function without a Rector.

In the meantime, all the members of the three PCCs, and those who will be involved in the vacancy and the appointment of a new Rector, are determined to keep everything running as normally as possible. I am sure that you'll be pleased to know that our schedule of services continues as usual, including those held in the week at Sacombe and Standon.

Christmas services are being planned and cover arranged as required. We are also busy finding clerical cover for our communion services, which is a big job. When we are not be able to fill all these, then we intend use 'communion by extension' subject to the permission of the Bishop, where



Braughing Parish Council

Work has been completed at Pentlows Meadow for the creation of a wetland area and improvement of The Quin with large amounts of gravel added to the riverbed. This did cause the river to look a bit cloudy for a few days but the longterm benefit is huge. The wetland area in the Meadow has been dug and planted up. We were delighted to see water in the new pond area straight away. (It will also fill with rain and directly from the River when it is running full). It will take a few months before all the work starts to naturalise but hopefully by next summer we will have the beginnings of a beautiful water meadow to enjoy.

Parking along the Street continues to be a huge issue. When cars are parked outside the Bear, where the road is so narrow, it makes it almost impossible for large vehicles (many of them agricultural vehicles) to get through resulting in damage to the buildings and the cars themselves. We are working with Highways and have been supported by Terry Smith, our County Councillor, in trying to seek a solution. Meanwhile it would really help if residents could avoid parking cars along that narrow stretch of the Street by the Brown Bear.

Unfortunately the 4 street lamps along church end were stolen in September. The Police think they

have identified the subject. The claim is with our insurers but we will endeavour to get the lights replaced asap.

Working Hard To B Together

As residents become more and more likely to ditch the two big parties when voting nationally, local councillors have been working hard to bring people together and to offer hope for those seeking change.

In Ware, Green Councillors on Ware Town Council have launched 'Ware Shares', a community service enabling people from the local area (including Puckeridge and Standon) to borrow DIY, garden and leisure equipment rather than buying them. This helps everyone save money by borrowing a tool for a small fee rather than buying it. It also helps save space by freeing up peoples' cupboards and sheds with tools collecting dust. Green Councillor Sue Nicholls, who has been involved in both initiatives, said: "It's been brilliant to see so many residents at the Repair Café and the Men's Shed, supporting each other and coming together in such a positive way. I want to say a massive thank you to all of the volunteers who've got involved and to Buntingford Town Council for funding support."

Green Councillor Phil Ricketts, Buntingford Men's Shed project leader, said: "We're now working to raise enough funds to secure a permanent home for the Men's Shed. This will enable us to make, repair, re-purpose and support projects for and provide a social space where shed members can to come together and connect with other people." The date for the next Repair Café is 24 January.

Citizens Advice East Herts is on a mission to rebuild and expand our face-to-face advice service, which has been significantly reduced since the pandemic. We know that our phone and email service suits many of our clients, particularly those who can't get into towns during the working day or people in rural locations with poor transport. However, we also know, because you tell us, that many of you miss the face-to-face interaction with an adviser, and for some this is an essential service for many different reasons, such as a hearing impairment, or a language

So, since May we have doubled the opening hours of our outreach sessions at the Methodist Church in Bishop's Stortford, open on Tuesdays from 10 to 2pm, and in September we opened a new outreach at Hertford Library on Wednesdays from 10 am to 2 pm. Make over ..not Move .

Having lived in this area and quite a few of the surrounding villages, I know we are blessed. The odd moan about the flightpath sometimes, squished verges, potholes etc., but look at the pluses. An area laced with woodlands and rivers, beautifully connected with many Rights of Way. Then... we decide maybe the grass is greener, as the saying goes, and we want bigger garden/more space. But hold on. Have you really optimised what you already have?

Be sure to get these repaired / renewed now as the rain and frost actions will ruin rendering and brickwork. Its amazing how an ongoing gutter leak can really invade the soffits/fascias and seep into the building, then suddenly you have serious damp/mould issues

This year our apples have been something special. We planted our orchard in 2012 with nine different varieties of cider apples and this year the crop has surpassed expectations. We must have produced over 50 tons. The warm spring and the hot summer was a massive bonus and the beehives in our orchard certainly did their job. Amber Bees, who make and market the honey, have an amazing apple honey. If you come across them at a local market, do try it

The Grape Harvest has been a DISASTER

This year has been one of the best harvests for British wine makers. We had a great spring, warm summer and it's been a bumper harvest for the industry, but not for us unfortunately. A local neighbour of mine texted me on the morning of 20 May to say they had a frost. Looking at our vineyard it all looked fine but on closer inspection the tips of the new growth had been burnt and as a result the vines produces virtually no grapes, we normally pick up to four tons of grapes. This year, picking the very best bunches, we only produced 25 kilos! To make it even more frustrating our two neighbouring vineyards were not affected at all.

We now start to start the maintenance work in the vineyard, replace some of the wooden poles with steel poles and in late November start the pruning process.

We can only hope for a better grape harvest next year.



The Hundred Parishes Society

www.hundredparishes.org.uk

The Hundred Parishes Society is not a church or religious organisation but we encourage visits to churches because they are often the oldest and most interesting building in any community. Most of our churches are open regularly and welcome visitors.

Our website www.hundredparishes.org.uk has many short articles, including some about various aspects of churches including bells, clocks, memorials, poppyheads, spires, towers and windows. We recently added an article about church fonts, some of which appears below.

Fonts hold holy water, which is used to 'baptise' people, an initiation into the Christian faith. They are often situated near the church entrance.

Our local churches have a great variety of fonts, usually made of stone. For example:

St. George's church in Anstey has an 11th-century font that is rare in that it is decorated with mermen (the male equivalent of mythical mermaids) holding their tails.

Thorley church has a 12th-century font. It was removed from the church and for many years was used as a drinking trough on a nearby farm before being reintroduced into the church in 1855. Its ornate cover was designed by George Gilbert Scott, a prolific architect known mainly for his work designing and renovating churches and cathedrals.

Chickney church has a carved stone font from the 14th century. The bowl is lavishly decorated including shields bearing the coats of arms of local Braybrook and Fitzwalter families.

Debden's 18th-century font is made of Coade stone and is richly decorated with roses and heraldry.

How can you protect yourself against Pension fraud?

Secure your online pension account: the account you use to manage your pension should have a different password to all of your other accounts. Use three random words to create a strong and memorable password, and enable 2-step verification (2SV).

Ignore unsolicited calls about your pension: cold calling about pensions is illegal and likely a sign of a scam. If you're thinking about changing your pension arrangements, you should get financial guidance or advice beforehand.

Investment opportunities: don't be rushed into making an investment. Remember, legitimate organisations will never pressure you into investing on the spot.

You should treat investment opportunities with extreme caution if there's:

- Pressure to invest (for example: time-limited offers).
- Downplayed risk of losing your money.
- Promised returns that sound too

good to be true.

What can you do if you have been a victim of pension fraud?
Report pension scams: if you're worried about a potential pension scam or you think you may have been contacted by a criminal, report it to Action Fraud at actionfraud. police.uk or by calling 0300 123 2040.

If you have made a payment: inform your bank or pension provider as soon as possible, they can help you prevent any further losses. Monitor your bank and pension statements regularly for any unusual activity.

Herts residents have been targeted by fraudsters posing as police officers The fraudsters called victims in St Albans, Watford and Kings Langley, who lost around £150,000 in total.

Your bank and the police will NEVER ring and ask you to verify your PIN, withdraw cash or purchase high-value goods. They'll also never come to your home to collect your card, cash or purchased items. If you get a call like this, end the call.

If you get a call from your bank or the police, make sure you know who the person is before handing over any personal details. You can do this by calling your bank (the number on the back of your card) or the police (101) on a different phone line.

- 2. Use secure carrying methods Avoid keeping your phone in back pockets or loosely in your hand. Use a zipped bag or front pocket, ideally with the opening facing inward when in a crowd.
- 3. Enable security features Set up a strong PIN, password, fingerprint, or facial recognition. Register your device's IMEI number (by dialling *#06#) with your network provider; this makes it easier to block if stolen.
- 4. Be cautious at hotspots for theft Phone theft is common near transport hubs, tourist attractions, and busy nightlife areas in UK cities like London, Manchester, and Birmingham. Avoid displaying your phone when standing near open train doors, escalators, or while cycling.
- 5. Use tracking and backup services Activate "Find My iPhone" (Apple) or "Find My Device" (Android). Regularly back up important data, so if your phone is stolen, you won't lose personal information.

Action Fraud, warning about quishing, a form of phishing where a fraudulent QR code is scanned

The warning encourages people to stay vigilant and double check QR

codes to see if they are malicious, or have been tampered with, before scanning them online or in public spaces.

Claire Webb, Acting Director of Action Fraud, said:

"We're urging people to stop and check before scanning QR codes, to avoid becoming a victim of quishing. Look out for QR codes that may have been tampered with in open spaces, or emails and texts that might include rogue codes. If you're in doubt, contact the organisation directly. You can follow our advice on quishing, on our website at www. actionfraud.police.uk to help protect yourself."

Action Fraud can reveal that quishing happens most frequently in car parks, with criminals using stickers to tamper with QR codes on parking machines. Quishing also occurred on online shopping platforms, where sellers received a QR code via email to either verify

accounts or to receive payment for sold items.

Reports also showed phishing attacks were taking placeimpersonating HMRC, or other UK government schemes, targeting people with QR codes designed to steal personal and financial details.

What can you do avoid being a victim of quishing?

- QR codes used in pubs or restaurants are usually safe to scan.
- Scanning QR codes in open spaces (like stations and car parks) might pose a greater risk. Check for signs that codes may have been tampered with (usually by a sticker placed over the legitimate QR code). If in doubt, do not scan them: use a search engine to find the official website or app for the organisation you need to make a payment to.
- If you receive an email with a QR code in it, and you're asked to scan it, you should be cautious.
- Finally, we recommend that you use the QR-scanner that comes with your phone, rather than using an app downloaded from an app store.

The Hundred Parishes Society

On a fine September day, I caught an early train to Ware before tackling the longest walk on the Society's website. Station Walk number 18 covers 17 miles (28 kilometres) between Ware Station and Stansted Mountfitchet Station. Although I walk regularly, it was some years since I last covered that distance in a day so I carried a mobile phone just in case.

An advantage of this route is that it heads north for several miles and then turns east, so for much of the way the sun is behind to give the best views.

After leaving Ware, the route is all in lovely countryside, passing through eight of our hundred parishes: Wareside, Standon, Thundridge, Braughing and Albury in Hertfordshire and then Farnham, Manuden and Stansted Mountfitchet in Essex. Through these parishes, only Standon and Stansted contributed much more than the occasional farmhouse. They, along with Gravesend in Albury, also



offered opportunities for refreshment.

The route follows a series of good paths and tracks, rising and falling between river valleys. It passes over the River Lea just after the start, spends several miles along the Rib valley, and crosses the Ash and the Stort.

The journey crosses the Greenwich Meridian, the original route of Roman Stane Street and the former Buntingford railway line. It passes beside Barwick Ford, Standon Lordship, Patmore Heath and Stansted Windmill and there are sightings of distant churches, water towers and much more. But the best views are of unspoilt, rolling countryside and occasional wildlife.

I completed the walk, accompanied for the last 6 miles by my wife Janice after lunch in Gravesend. Altogether, a most enjoyable day – and the legs only ached a bit for the next few days! Having completed this challenge, I can return to the many shorter routes on our website.

- Set clear rules from the beginning
- Agree on boundaries together: what's OK to do online, how long to spend on devices, and how to treat others with respect. Kids need structure and support to make smart choices online.
- Make the most of built-in tools
- Use parental controls on devices, games, browsers, and social platforms. Enable privacy settings, safe search features, and family filters from your internet provider. These tools add an extra layer of protection.
- Be cautious with video calls
- Always update apps to their latest version and adjust settings to ensure calls are private and secure. Allow communication only with trusted contacts.
- Talk about online gaming
- Gaming can help kids with creativity and problem solving – but it can also expose them to strangers, pressure to spend money, or risky behaviours. Make time to chat about the games they play and how they use them.
- Teach critical thinking about online content
- Help your child spot misinformation, fake news, and AI-generated content. Encourage them to question what they see and avoid sharing unverified content.
- Remind them to think before they share:

Personal details, photos, videos—once they're online, they can be hard to take back. Talk to your child about what's appropriate to post and how to protect their and others' privacy.

Stick to trusted sources for apps

Download apps only from official stores like Google Play or the App Store. Where possible, use your own email address when creating accounts for your child.

Stay observant, not overbearing

Keep an eye on your child's online behaviour and watch for warning signs. Sadly, some young people have been targeted for serious online threats—from scams and grooming to involvement in criminal activity.
